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Secretary of State's Office Speaks with County Officials to Stop Fraudulent Business Filings in Wyoming

On May 23, Secretary Gray and Business Division Director Colin Crossman spoke at the 2024 meeting of the Wyoming County Treasurers' Association in Saratoga concerning the Secretary of State's collaborative efforts to combat business fraud in Wyoming. On May 29, Secretary Gray sent a [letter](#) to Wyoming County Assessors detailing common instances of fraud and ways county officials can report fraud to the state.

“Our office is dedicated to serving the people of Wyoming and maintaining the integrity of business operations and records,” Secretary of State Chuck Gray said in a statement. “Our actions to administratively dissolve fraudulent entities is an important step to maintaining this integrity. It is important that county officials in Wyoming, who are uniquely and acutely aware of instances and patterns of fraudulent behavior, work with our office to stop and deter fraud.”



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
