Secretary Gray Applauds House Passage of Proof of Citizenship, Residency Requirements to Vote

CHEYENNE, WY – On January 20th, the Wyoming House of Representatives passed House Bill 156 and House Bill 157, which require proof of United States citizenship and proof of Wyoming residency to register to vote in Wyoming. Requiring proof of voter citizenship and Wyoming residency represent the number one plank of Secretary Gray's [election integrity reform agenda](#). House Bill 156 passed the House on Third reading 51-8, and House Bill 157 passed the House on Third reading 53-6.

“I applaud the House’s passage of House Bill 156 and 157,” Secretary Gray said in a statement. “By requiring documentary proof of United States citizenship and Wyoming residency, we will ensure only United States Citizens and only Wyomingites are voting in Wyoming elections. I want to commend the House’s passage of these bills, which have been priority number one of our election integrity agenda. I look forward to continuing to work with the Legislature to achieve meaningful, conservative reform.”
