Secretary Gray Celebrates House Passage of Third Key Priority of Election Integrity Agenda with Bills to Strengthen Wyoming's Voter ID Law

CHEYENNE, WY – On February 3rd, the Wyoming House of Representatives passed House Bill 206, which requires photo ID on all forms of identification used for voter ID. The House also passed House Bill 160, which removed student IDs from the list of acceptable forms of identification to vote. Secretary of State Chuck Gray testified in favor of both bills. Strengthening Wyoming's Voter ID statute was a priority of Secretary Gray's [election integrity reform agenda](#) announced earlier this year. House Bill 206 passed the House on Third reading 49-8, and House Bill 160 passed the House on Third reading 53-8.

“I applaud the House's passage of House Bill 206 and House Bill 160, strengthening Wyoming's voter ID law, the third key priority of our election integrity agenda,” Secretary Gray said in a statement. “I am extremely supportive of the work that is being done to strengthen Wyoming's Voter ID statute, and continue to enhance election integrity. Requiring true photo ID for Voter ID so that we have true voter ID in Wyoming is a key priority of our election integrity reform agenda, and the passage of these bills advances this key policy priority.”
