## **Secretary Gray Celebrates Wyoming House's Passage of Entire Election Integrity Agenda with Passage of Measures to Ban Foreign Funding of Ballot Measures, Ban Ranked Choice Voting, Strengthen Voter List Maintenance**

**CHEYENNE, WY** – On February 12th, the Wyoming House of Representatives passed House Bill 165, which bans ranked choice voting in Wyoming, House Bill 318, which ensures proper voter list maintenance and clean voter rolls, and House Bill 337, which prohibits foreign funding of ballot measures in Wyoming. The passage of these bills marks the passage in the House of the entirety of Wyoming Secretary of State Chuck Gray's [election integrity reform agenda](#) announced in December 2024. Earlier this session, the House passed measures to require proof of citizenship and residency to vote, ban ballot drop boxes, strengthen Wyoming's Voter ID statute, ban ballot harvesting, impose a durational residency requirement to vote in Wyoming, ban foreign funding of election administration, and provide for hand recounts of elections. These bills will not move onto the Senate. These bills will now be considered by the Senate.

“The Wyoming House’s passage of our entire conservative election integrity reform agenda is a wonderful moment for our state. It is so important that action has been taken to advance all of these conservative election integrity issues that the people of Wyoming want. As the 2025 Legislative Session moves forward, I look forward to continuing to work with the Wyoming Legislature to achieve meaningful, conservative election integrity reform.”
