Secretary Gray Statement in Full Support of President Trump's Executive Order to Protect the Integrity of American Elections

CHEYENNE, WY – On March 25, 2025, President Donald Trump signed an Executive Order to preserve and protect the integrity of American elections. The executive order will require documentary proof of United States citizenship on federal voter registration forms, prohibit foreign interference in U.S. elections, encourage use of pen and paper ballots, and require enhanced voter list maintenance procedures, and other key priorities of President Trump. These are also key priorities of Secretary Gray's that were worked on in the 2025 General Session, with House Bill 156, Proof of U.S. Citizenship for Registering to Vote (became law without the governor's signature), House Bill 337, Banning Foreign Funding of Elections (signed into law), House Bill 318, Voter List Maintenance (signed into law), and House Bill 245, Pen and Paper Ballots (passed House but failed to be introduced in the Senate).

In a statement expressing his support for the executive order, Secretary Gray stated, "I truly appreciate and applaud President Trump for signing this executive order and for continuing to work to make our elections safe and secure. I want to express my full support. In the 2025 General Session, we began carrying out these priorities by working to pass bills requiring proof of citizenship to vote for all races, prohibiting foreign funding of ballot measures, and strengthening Wyoming's voter list maintenance procedures. This executive order is an extremely important moment for election integrity."
