Secretary Gray Applauds U.S. House Passage of SAVE Act to Ensure Proof of Citizenship to Vote Nationwide

CHEYENNE, WY – On April 10th, the United States House of Representatives passed H.R. 22, the Safeguard American Voter Eligibility (SAVE) Act. The SAVE Act requires proof of United States citizenship to register to vote for all federal elections. Requiring proof of citizenship to register to vote has been the number one priority of Secretary Gray's [election integrity reform agenda](#) announced in 2024. During the 2025 Legislative Session, the Wyoming Legislature passed House Bill 156, which is modeled after the SAVE Act and requires proof of citizenship and proof of Wyoming residency to register to vote in all elections in Wyoming.

"I applaud the United States House of Representatives' passage of the SAVE Act, which is a common sense election integrity legislation to ensure only American citizens can vote in American elections by requiring documentary proof of United States citizenship to register to vote across the country," Secretary Gray said in a statement. "Proof of citizenship for registering to vote is so important. Only United States citizens should be voting in American elections. Period. And I'm proud of our work in implementing these priorities in Wyoming, with the passage of House Bill 156, requiring proof of U.S. citizenship and proof of Wyoming residency to vote in all Wyoming elections. I applaud President Trump, Speaker Johnson, Congresswoman Hageman, and all Republicans in the U.S. Congress who supported the SAVE ACT. With its passage by the U.S. House, I look forward to its being passed by the United States Senate."
