Secretary Gray Welcomes President Trump's U.S. Department of Justice Statement of Interest Supporting Wyoming Proof of Citizenship Voter Law

CHEYENNE, WY – On July 1, 2025, the United States Department of Justice filed a Motion for Leave to File a Statement of Interest in the U.S. District Court for Wyoming in *Equality State Policy Center v. Chuck Gray et al,* supporting Wyoming's interest in requiring documentary proof of citizenship to register to vote. The Statement of Interest states in part, "[i]n this case, the Court should conclude that requiring documentary proof of citizenship, like the voter ID requirement upheld in *Crawford,* is a valid method to achieve the state's legitimate interests."

"I want to thank President Trump for his leadership and President Trump's Department of Justice for filing a Statement of Interest in support of our position to defend proof of United States citizenship to register to vote. Proof of citizenship for registering to vote is a common sense, conservative measure pivotal to election integrity, and has been a key part of President Trump's Executive Order to Preserve and Protect the Integrity of American Elections.
